A Port Orchard resident working for another fire district is telling us the masses are coming (Kitsap Sun letters, June 2). If a firefighter who works for the district is as passionate about this district and shares a letter with us, I am all ears. More scare tactics, just written a bit differently. What else would you call it when we are told we might not get attention due to manning? Yet the Chief says we call, he will come! At South Kitsap Fire and Rescue, 86% of their budget is for salaries. Claims of a cash shortage are due to poor financial management and use of precious resources.

Our group had to do a request for public records to find out how many and how much cash they spent to buy six new properties. That's \$2.2 million right there. What happened to just 15 new employees needed over two or three years?

And what about manpower shortages? No shortage of high-dollar chief, assistant chiefs, division chiefs, captains, lieutenants, for a start.
